Dr. Yeung Ka-ching is a Senior Teaching Consultant in the Department of Social Work and Social Administration, the University of Hong Kong. He is a scholar in family study, an expert in parenting and family therapy. He started teaching in 1990 covering subjects such as “social work with families”, “career skills training”, “family therapy” and “individual counseling”. His Ph.D thesis was on how marital conflict influences the development of adolescents in Hong Kong. He has been appointed as the member of the Women’s Commission since Jan. 2005.
