Introduction	Ethics is concerned with questions of how people ought to act. It is not about abstract principles, but is rather a practical guide, with which we can examine what we believe to be the right actions, and how the individual and society could be benefited. Learning Ethics can facilitate students to understand how to live together in diverse societies and develop the sense of belonging to a community.			
	The purpose of this course is to encourage students to engage in a discussion focusing on what they believe to make an action right or wrong, and to learn how to provide reasons to support their claims.			
	The course is designed to be discussion-based. The scenes from the films to be screened during each class will be used as discussion materials that encourage students to explore issues with the ethical principles to be introduced in the class.

(1<sup>st</sup> priority, 2<sup>nd</sup> priority, 3<sup>rd</sup> priority, etc). 1 token is required for each programme (For programme list, please refer to the issue 23 of Gifted Gateway (click here));</li> <li>The application can only be submitted once. After submission of the application, the programme selection and the priority cannot be changed;</li> <li>If a student member removes a programme from the application before the application deadline by withdrawal, the choice priority will remain unchanged. (For example: A student has selected three programmes and removed the programme.)</li> </ul>
