	Have you ever been waiting for your favourite songs from the radio? When was the last time you listened to the radio?
	The golden age of radio seems to have gone. Nowadays the people prefer listening to music from streaming service, however, the speaker is still keen on recommending his choice of international and local indie music through radio broadcasting for 30 years. In this workshop, the speaker will share with you his experiences in radio broadcasting and other cross-cultural projects.
	Dr Wong Chi Chung, Elvin is a veteran radio DJ, music critic, and curator. He plays an active role in promoting international and local music culture through various cross-cultural projects, such as David Bowie's Mandarin song (1997), <i>Dream Come True 80 Days Around the World</i> (2000), <i>PoPo Song</i> (2004), <i>James Wong Study</i> (2005), <i>Centennial Exhibition of Chinese Records</i> (2006), <i>Hong Kong Pop/Performing Culture</i> (2007), 'Farewell Ka Kui' 15th Anniversary (2008), Gen-S Concert (2010), Hong Kong Week in Taipei (2012), Ryuichi Sakamoto's <i>async</i> (2017), and Cantopop oral history for the Hong Kong Heritage Museum (2021).
