◆ Introduction

Forensic science is the science of finding clues and uncovering the truth. Forensic anthropologists are indispensable members of forensic institutions, specializing in the study of skeletons. Their skills help to unravel many unsolved cases in courts. The work of a forensic anthropologist can also go far beyond this. In this talk, you will learn more about the application of forensic anthropology in and out of the courts, including, forensic, bioarcheology, humanitarian work in war-torn and disaster areas, science and culture studies, etc.. The speaker would also share the code of ethics and values of her profession.

The speaker, Ms Hin Shin Winsome Lee, is one of the few forensic anthropologists in Hong Kong, and one of the Hong Kong Red Cross Humanity Award 2021 awardees. She is also a famous writer of forensic anthropology books. Her book series is popular among Hong Kong secondary school students; Meanwhile, she is a contributing writer on online media. Her regular column shares forensic, science, history, and cultural stories related to forensic anthropologists. In addition to the experience of working in mortuary and related forensic institutions, Ms Lee also contributed her expertise as a forensic anthropologist and consultant at the international level. Her footsteps could be found in Somaliland, Timor-Leste, Poland, Papua New Guinea and all around the world.
