Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the programme, student members should be able to:

1. identify any challenge(s) that they may encountered rooted from giftedness;
2. describe possible solutions to corresponding challenges from multiple perspectives;
3. enhance sense of identity as a gifted student;
4. enhance peer support connection.



◆ Introduction of the Talk

As a gifted student, have you ever felt different from others because of your gifted characteristics? Is it difficult to find peer support to share your feelings and thoughts?

According to the survey, the proportion of gifted students is about 2 to 3% of the overall student population. Based on the current number of students in Hong Kong, there are around 20,000 gifted students. With about 1,000 primary and secondary schools in Hong Kong, each school has about 20 gifted students. Many gifted students shared with us that they seldom or never have classmates as members of the HKAGE, and sometimes it is difficult to share their life as gifted students with others.

Therefore, "Gifted Life Matters" will let participants get together and share their unique experiences as gifted students. Each workshop will focus on some interesting things or challenge(s) rooted in gifted characteristics. Through discussion and sharing with others, participants will be able to understand how to deal with the corresponding challenges from various perspectives (including yourself, parents, schools, and the policy.)

This workshop will explore the difference in life brought about by perfectionism.
