Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the programme, student members should be able to:

- 1. have a basic understanding of common mental health problems in young people
- 2. aware the signs of mental health problems or crisis and give support before the problems getting worse
- 3. assist the young persons to seek for professional help or receive appropriate community resources
- 4. enhance empathy and social awareness.



Introduction of the Course

In response to the epidemic and changes in the social environment in recent years, adolescents are facing great pressure in life, studies and the future. Learning "Youth Mental Health First Aid" can be able to provide immediate help to those around you when an emergency occurs.

The course -" Youth Mental Health First Aid" developed in Australia, Its purpose was similar to physiological first aid, which is the help provided to a person who has a developing mental illness or is in a mental health crisis. The first aid is given until appropriate professional treatment is received or until the crisis has been resolved.

The course will be focused on adolescent development and what signs and symptoms to look out for early detection of mental health problems developing in young people up to the age of 24, including: anxiety disorders, eating disorder, depression, substance misuse and psychosis. It is a 14-hour training course involving theoretical lecture supplemented with video, practical exercise and guiz.
