Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the gifted programme, gifted students should be able to:

- 1. differentiate between work, career, and mission, and articulate their personal definitions of each;
- 2. identify their personality type and explain how it relates to potential career choices;
- 3. articulate their core values and connect them to fulfilling career paths;
- 4. assess realistic considerations, such as required education, skills, and job market trends, when exploring career options; and
- 5. develop a preliminary career plan incorporating self-assessment, exploration, and goal-setting strategies.

Introduction of the Talk

The well-being of gifted students is crucial for their overall development. This talk delves into the critical area of vocational well-being, offering practical solutions and strategies for growth. This is part of our broader exploration of the six key dimensions of well-being: physical, social and emotional, spiritual, intellectual, vocational, and community. This talk will empower gifted students to explore fulfilling career paths by understanding the interplay of work, career, and mission, aligning career choices with personality and values, and developing effective career planning strategies. The talk will conclude with a Q&A session, providing opportunities for further exploring issues related to the topic of this talk.

Profile of the Speaker

Dr. Richard LAU obtained an Honours Bachelor's degree in Psychology in the UK, an Honours Master's degree in Clinical Psychology in Australia, a Postgraduate Diploma in Clinical Psychiatry in the UK, a PhD in Clinical Psychology in the US, and a PhD in Counseling in Australia, and he is pursuing a Master of Science degree in Clinical Psychiatry in the UK. He is a Clinical Psychologist in the accredited register in Hong Kong (Department of Health), an Associate Fellow and Registered Clinical Psychologist of the Hong Kong Psychological Society, a Full Member of the Hong Kong Clinical Psychologists Association, an Associate Fellow of the Hong Kong Professional Counseling Association, a Registered Clinical Supervisor of the Asian Professional Counseling & Psychology Association, a Certified Clinical Hypnotherapist of the Professional Board of Hypnotherapy, Inc., an Academic Member of the College of Clinical Psychologists of the Australian Psychological Society, and a Full Member of the Australian Psychological Society.



Profile of the Speaker

Dr. LAU worked as a Senior Clinical Psychologist or Director of Psychological Services in nongovernmental organizations and private psychology centers for approximately ten years, during which time he developed numerous training programs for gifted individuals and their parents. Over the past eighteen years, he has held teaching positions at various universities, including Senior Lecturer in the Department of Special Education and Counseling, Faculty of Education and Human Development at The Education University of Hong Kong; Assistant Professor at the Nethersole School of Nursing, Faculty of Medicine, The Chinese University of Hong Kong; Assistant Professor in the Department of Counseling and Psychology, Faculty of Social Sciences, Hong Kong Shue Yan University; and Visiting Professor at the Faculty of Social Sciences and Education, University of Saint Joseph (current name). Through his university teaching, Dr. LAU has delivered numerous courses related to teaching and counseling students with special educational needs, including gifted students. He has also trained a significant number of professional teachers, counselors, and social workers in methods for teaching, counseling, and supporting gifted students and their families.
