Introduction

Although individuals would be affected by any kind of crises in our living and environment, we can only stay our discussion away from the environmental crises (e.g. financial crisis, business crisis, or natural crisis) which involve a very big scope but to focus on the crises closely related to individuals in this two hours seminar. In this seminar, the speaker will explain different possible crises in individual life, and those possible aspects that may be affected by those crises. The speaker will then focus on the psychological, emotional, social, and behavioural aspects that crises would have a negative impact on individuals, and will suggest suitable crisis management strategies for handling or resolving those crises in life. There will be a Q&A session during the seminar.

Dr Richard LAU is a registered clinical psychologist of the Hong Kong Institute of Clinical Psychologists which is fully accredited by the Department of Health. He is also an associate fellow and registered clinical psychologist of the Hong Kong Psychological Society, a full member of the Hong Kong Clinical Psychologists Association, an associate fellow of the Hong Kong Professional Counselling Association, a registered clinical supervisor of the Asian Professional Counselling & Psychology Association, a certified clinical hypnotherapist of the Professional Board of Hypnotherapy, Inc., and a full member of the Australian Psychological Society.

For more than ten years, Dr Richard LAU has developed many training programmes for the gifted population and their parents in various private or non-government organisations in Hong Kong.
