



Parent Workshop: Whole Person Development of Gifted Children (F1PWP002W)

Introduction

This is the second workshop of a series of parent workshop with a purpose of exploring with parents practical ways and skills that their children need to recognize and acquire during the process of their whole person development. In each of this series of workshop, the facilitator will give participants opportunities to share if their children have any difficulties in acquiring wisdom in life, developing necessary responsibility and perseverance in life, acquiring crises management skills in life, building desirable habits in life, or building desirable mindsets in life. Hence, the facilitator will enlighten the participants with useful ways or skills in promoting all those qualities mentioned, so that participants will know how to guide their children in enhancing those qualities in their whole person development journey.

2	Enhancing Responsibility and Perseverance in Life

Objectives

To equip parents with skills in developing their children's responsibility and perseverance.

Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this session of workshop, parents should be able to acquire skills to:

1. Acquire skills to get rid of factors that negatively related to the sense of responsibility and perseverance, including speed demon, procrastination, unwillingness to try, self-defeating attitude, fidgeting, etc.
2. Acquire skills to promote factors positively related to the sense of responsibility and perseverance, including peer effects, self-control, sense of pride, self-worth, etc.
3. Acquire skills to promote the sense of responsibility and perseverance of their gifted children.

Dr Richard LAU is a registered clinical psychologist of the Hong Kong Institute of Clinical Psychologist which is fully accredited by the Department of Health. He is also an associate fellow and registered clinical psychologist of the Hong Kong Psychological Society, a full member of the Hong Kong Clinical Psychologists Association, an associate fellow of the Hong Kong Professional Counselling Association, a registered clinical supervisor of the Asian Professional Counselling & Psychology Association, a certified clinical hypnotherapist of the Professional Board of Hypnotherapy, Inc., and a full member of the Australian Psychological Society.

For more than ten years, Dr Richard LAU has developed many training programmes for the gifted population and their parents in various private or non-government organisations in Hong Kong. He was a senior lecturer at the Department of Special Education and Counselling, Faculty of Education and Human Development in The Education University of Hong Kong; an assistant professor at the Nethersole School of Nursing, Faculty of Medicine of the Chinese University of Hong Kong; an assistant professor at the Department of Counselling and Psychology, Faculty of Social Sciences of the Hong Kong Shue Yan University; and a visiting professor at the Faculty of Social Sciences and Education of the University of Saint Joseph (current name) over the last twelve years.
