# **Intended Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of this seminar, parents should be able to:

- 1. understand how to establish a long-term cooperative relationships with their gifted children;
- 2. understand what gifted students would transit, face, and learn as they enter university;
- 3. understand the favourable and unfavourable adaptive factors found by gifted students entering university;
- 4. understand some of the situations that gifted students encounter when they enter the working stage; and
- 5. understand factors or contributors to the success of gifted students (in school, career, and life).



Introduction

Parents who have been caring for and nurturing their gifted children as they grow up must feel great comfort when their children are about to enter universities or later in the workforce. But at the same time, parents may also have various thoughts or feelings in their minds and want to know what they can do for their children during these stages. The speaker of this talk, Dr Richard LAU, will explain to parents how to build a long-term cooperative relationships with their gifted children, and let parents understand the situations that gifted students are likely to face when entering university or work, the favourable and unfavourable adaptive factors they may find in universities, and the factors and contributors to the success of gifted students which could help parents attending the seminar to provide better support for their children.
