Introduction

Everyone in the world is made up of many different and unique habits. If a person shows different behavior patterns every day, people around him must think that person is unpredictable. However, if most of a person's habits are considered undesirable by others, will people like this type of person? So, of course, we want to have more desirable habits, so that we can benefit ourselves. Dr Lau, the speaker in this seminar, will explain to the participants that habits appear in all aspects of individuals' life while building habit cannot be achieved by simply asking people to do so as the process of forming habits not only depends on individuals' personalities but also their interests, support and recognition from others, and extrinsic motivation. Dr Lau will also explain various types of desirable or undesirable habits in life and the consequences led by those desirable or undesirable habits, respectively. He is also an associate fellow and registered clinical psychologist of the Hong Kong Psychological Society, and a certified clinical hypnotherapist of the Professional Board of Hypnotherapy, Inc. For about ten years, he worked as a senior clinical psychologist or the services director in various NGO and private psychological centres in Hong Kong. He also taught full-time and part-time in various local and overseas universities as assistant professor and visiting professor for almost seventeen years, Dr LAU has developed many training programmes for the gifted population and their parents over these years.
