Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the gifted programme, gifted students should be able to:

1. implement creative problem-solving skills to deal with own's problems;
2. face the daily life challenges by thinking outside of the box and challenging oneself;
3. learn to appreciate and accept gifted characteristics through the collaboration with peers; and
4. consolidate what you have learnt through the demonstration of project results.

◆ Gifted Programme Introduction

'Be Together' Parent-child Group is a parent-child programme for gifted students and their parents. The programme design is based on the Creative Problem Solving (CPS) model and infused affective elements such as parent-child communication, self-understanding and peer learning in an interactive learning environment. Through this programme parents and children can enhance their creative problem-solving skills, make innovations and achieve breakthroughs. Children and their peers also have opportunities to communicate, collaborate and share their achievements through a range of activities. They will learn to appreciate each other and enhance their problem solving, collaboration, questioning, presentation, and multi-perspective thinking skills. (This programme content was identical to '1+1 group' in 21/22 school year.)

Ms Tinsley Du obtained a master's degree of social sciences in counselling psychology from the Hong Kong Shue Yan University, and she is a Registered Counselling Psychologist of The Hong Kong Psychological Society Limited (HKPS). Tinsley worked as Counsellor in local schools and as Service Officer and Counselling Psychologist in NGO. She supported students with various psychological and educational needs, and offered counselling, psychotherapy, whole person development service for them. She also offered counselling, psychotherapy, and conducted talks and workshops for parents, teachers, and the public of different ages including children, teenagers, and adults.
